ENTRY RULES

- All entries are to be made online through www.nominate.com.au.
- All entries must include a commentator form and complete medical armband details
- All riders in classes Pre Novice and above must be full financial members (or junior members) of Equestrian Australia (EA)
- All riders in classes Introductory and Preliminary must hold a minimum of associate level membership to Equestrian Australia
- All riders in classes CIC*, CIC**, and CIC*** must be registered with FEI
- All horses in classes CIC*, CIC**, and CIC*** must be registered with FEI
- Entries are restricted to 40 per class, if sufficient entries some classes may be split.
- ALL FEI classes will showjump in reverse order of placings
- Presentation is to be MOUNTED for ALL placegetters (*in the event that the same rider places on more than 1 horse in the class it is acceptable for the lower placed horse be led by a groom*)
- The organizing committee reserves the right to modify the schedule in order to clarify any matters or matters arising from an omission or due to unforeseen circumstances.
- A draw for all classes will be posted on nominate on Friday 26th March 2010

GENERAL CONDITIONS

CONDITIONS OF ENTRY

- The organizing committee reserves the right to restrict the total number of entries in each class
- Any rider wishing to compete is advised to obtain a copy of the applicable FEI and EA rule books. These can be found online at www.equestrian.org.au and www.fei.org
- The committee reserves the right to conduct a ballot at its discretion
- Non-competitive horses will not be permitted at the venue for the duration of the event
- Absolutely no competitor vehicles or bikes are permitted on the WHT XC course at any time for the duration of the event

TICKETING

VETERINARY EXAMINATIONS & HORSE INSPECTIONS

These will be carried out in accordance with the “Veterinary Regulations”, Art.1011 & “Rules for Eventing” Art 518.1 for CCIs and 518.2 for CICs

Art 511.2.2

Every horse entered for any competition at CCNs, CICs 2/1* or CCIs 2/1* in a foreign country (GRs Art 141.2), and all horses entered for CICs 3*, CCIs 4/3*, CCIOs, Championships, Regional and Olympic games, whether at home or in

foreign countries, must have an official valid FEI passport, or a national passport approved by the FEI and accompanied by an FEI Recognition Card and, when applicable and FEI registration number, as a means of identification and to establish ownership.

Art 511.2.3

Horses taking part in CCNs, CICs 2/1* or CCI 2/1* in the country in which they are resident are not required to have such a passport as is mentioned Paragraph 2.2. All such horses must be properly registered and identifiable and unless there is no national requirement for equine influenza vaccination in the host country and in the country of origin, all horses must have a valid vaccination certificate.

SAMPLING PROCEDURES FOR PROHIBITED SUBSTANCES

(VET. REGS. CH.V & VI AND ANNEX IV)

- Regular sampling is carried out in CCIs 4/3*, CCIOs, World Cup™ Qualifiers and Finals, Championships and Games, whereas at other CCIs sampling is recommended. When testing takes place the number of horses tested is at the discretion of the Testing Veterinarian / Veterinary Delegate; however, a minimum of three (3) is recommended (Vet. Regs. Art. 1016).
- Special guidelines are applicable for events covered by the FEI Medication Control Programme
- Competitors whose horses have been selected for sampling will be instructed by an official to present their horse immediately to the box prepared for the purpose, and must comply with such officials instructions. A steward will accompany the horse & rider to the swabbing box.
- Approved Laboratory:
Australian Racing Forensic laboratory, P.O. Box 3, Randwick Racecourse, Randwick, NSW. 2031
- Rider testing may be carried out.

FIRST EXAMINATION (ARRIVAL INSPECTIONS)

The purpose of the arrival examination is to establish the identity of the horse and establish the state of the health of the horse. Specific details are as follows:

- Times of examination:

Thursday 1 st April	2pm to 4pm
Friday 2 nd April	7am to 9am

- All FEI horses must be presentation for examination before it is permitted to enter the competition area
- The horse's passport/identification document/EFA registration certificate must be up to date. Please ensure you have all of your documentation with you at the inspections, any horse without documentation at the inspections will not be permitted to start the competition
- Horse inspections & Examination prior to the commencement of the jumping will be in accordance with article 519 Rules for Eventing and Article 1011 Veterinary Regulations

EXERCISING OF HORSES

- Competitors may exercise their horses in the areas designated
- Competitors may not ride on, over or near the course nor enter the dressage arenas under penalty of elimination.
